## What is the Ontario by Bike Network?

GOAL: To develop and promote cycle tourism in Ontario through a network of bicycle friendly businesses that together enhance the region's cycle tourism product.

- OBB certifies businesses as bicycle friendly
- Different business categories have to meet criteria to verify that they are ready to welcome cyclists to their location
- There are more than 1,680 businesses certified in Ontario
- OBB has 9,021 followers and 5,337 Instagram followers
- OBB industry E-newsletter has 2,572 subscribers

## What Does the Ontario by Bike Network Do?

- OBB certifies businesses as bicycle friendly
- Promotes cycling & cycle tourism to consumers
- Participates in travel shows and cycling events
- Industry workshops and operator training
- Destination & product development consulting
- Cycle tourism & event research
- Ontario By Bike Rides: Small Group Tours





## **Cycle Tourism in Ontario**

- 47% of cyclists had visited one or more businesses certified as bicycle friendly by OBB in past 2 years
- 37% of cyclists not yet aware of the certification program
- 49% of cyclists are aged 45 to 64 (34% are over 65)
- Cyclists under age 44 grew by 8% since 2021
- 44% of cyclists are retired, 47% work full-time
- 57% of cyclists identified as male, 42% as female
- 52% prefer a daily ride distance of 46km to 99 km
- 62% ride year round and in shoulder seasons





# Cycle Tourism in Ontario 2022 Visitor Numbers and Spending

- Source: Statistics Canada's National Travel Survey 2022: MTCS
- 1.2 million cycling visits in Ontario, representing 1% of total visits in Ontario
- Spent \$565 million accounting for 2.35% of total visitor spending in Ontario
- Largest spending categories (in order) are:
  - Accommodations
  - Food and Beverage
  - Transportation





# Cycle Tourism in Ontario 2022 Visitor Numbers and Spending

- Cycle tourists spend more and stay longer in Ontario
- \$537/trip vs. \$421/trip by non-cyclists
- Same-day visitors \$337/trip vs. \$114/trip by non-cyclists
- Cyclists 4.2 overnight stays nights vs. 2.9 overnight stays by non-cyclists
- 61% of cycling visits were overnight
- 32% of cyclists spend over \$150 per night accommodation
- Top activity preference for Ontario cyclists are visiting museums and cultural sights, culinary experiences, wine and beer tastings, beach, hiking, arts and studio tours





## Being a Bicycle Friendly Business

- OBB is free for businesses who comply with the certification criteria for each category and they must be located in the region where the program is offered
- Categories include:
  - Accommodation providers
  - Campgrounds
  - Food services providers
  - Tourist attractions
  - Business areas
  - Other cycling-related business / organizations

- Staff able to direct cyclists to information on cycling routes in immediate area, local bike shops, hours, bicycle rental and tour operators, weather reports.
- Basic bicycle repair toolset
- Healthy, local food and beverage options, if served on-site
- Assistance with OBB network evaluation and data, when possible
- All frontline staff informed of participation in OBB network and above services and amenities
- Any additional requirements that may be established through consultation with OBB
- See OBB website for list of suggested additional services



#### **CAMPGROUNDS**

- Secure daytime bike lock-up (bicycle stands or posts in visible location)
- Cycling information, including any published cycling route maps (or access to internetconnected computer)
- Staff able to direct cyclists to information on cycling routes in immediate area, local bike shops, hours, bicycle rental and tour operators, weather reports.
- Basic bicycle repair toolset
- Healthy, local food and beverage options, if served on-site
- Assistance with OBB network evaluation and data, when possible
- All frontline staff informed of participation in OBB network and above services and amenities
- Any additional requirements that may be established through consultation with OBB
- See OBB website for list of suggested additional services



#### **FOOD SERVICES (restaurants, cafes, food shops)**

- Healthy food options on menu
- Inclusion of local foods and specialties, whenever possible
- Secure daytime bike lock-up area in most visible location possible or provision for cyclists to bring bikes onto property (e.g. patio)
- Cycling information, for region, if available, including any published cycling route maps
- Assistance with OBB network evaluation and data, when possible
- All frontline staff informed of participation in OBB network and above services and amenities
- Any additional requirements that may be established through consultation with OBB
- See OBB website for list of suggested additional services





#### **TOURIST ATTRACTIONS**

- Secure daytime bike lock-up area in most visible location possible
- Access to washrooms (where possible), rest area (preferably covered), and water (either fountain or by purchase from a concession stand)
- Cycling information, for region, if available, including any published cycling route maps
- Healthy local food and beverage options, if served on-site
- Assistance with OBB network evaluation and data, when possible
- All frontline staff informed of participation in OBB network and above services and amenities
- Any additional requirements that may be established through consultation with OBB
- See OBB website for list of suggested additional services





#### **BUSINESS AREAS (BIAs)**

- Registration must be through BIA, or Chamber of Commerce
- A minimum of 5 applicable businesses in the BIA are participating and certified as bicyclefriendly locations including 1 in each of the categories (food services and attractions and 3 may be from any category)
- A certified accommodation located with a reasonable cycling distance away (10 km or less)
- Ample bike parking, one storefront designed and promoted as a Bike Welcome Centre equipped with a bike repair station and up to date local cycling information and maps
- o Cycling infrastructure and/or signed route in and out of proposed business area
- Dedicated webpage indicating Bike Friendly designation, listing certified bicycle-friendly business locations
- Must be in located in a region supporting the OBB Network
- All association staff informed of participation in OBB network and above services and

### **RTO3 Hamilton Halton Brant Partnership**

#### HOW THIS PROGRAM CAN ASSIST WITH OBB CERTIFICATION

- Supports tourism related businesses in achieving OBB Certification
- Encourages cycle-friendly infrastructure, services, and promotion
- Available to first-time OBB applicants
- Aligns with RTO3's goal of experiential and sustainable tourism
- RTO3 will work directly with OBB during the certification process
- RTO3 will provide applicants with OBB contacts and resource materials





### **RTO3 Hamilton Halton Brant Partnership**

#### **HOW TO APPLY – KEY STEPS**

- Applicant to review Ontario by Bike certification criteria and contact OBB staff to discuss what is needed to meet the requirements
- Submit-online application to RTO3 to apply for co-funding
- RTO3 will discuss the application with OBB to determine eligibility
- If approved RTO3 will pay up to \$500 to assist with the applicant's needs.
  - Example: (1) Purchase and installation of a bicycle rack(s)
    - (2) Purchase of First Aid Kit(s)
    - (3) Purchase of Bicycle Toolkit(s)

Deadline to submit application is October 31, 2025





### **RTO3 Hamilton Halton Brant Partnership**

#### **HOW TO APPLY – KEY STEPS**

- RTO3 will prepare a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for applicant's signature
- Applicant returns to RTO3
  - Signed MOU
  - Void Cheque and direct deposit bank form
  - Quotations for equipment purchases
- Following selection of vendor(s), RTO3 invoices the applicant for payment of their 50% of the cost which is paid to RTO3.
- RTO3 will pay the invoice(s) directly to the vendor.
- The maximum amount of RTO3's shared contribution will be up to \$500.
